I-80 is the second longest Interstate Highway in the United States and runs from San Francisco, CA on the west coast to Teaneck, NJ on the east coast. Kewanee is located 10 miles south of the I-80/IL Route 78 interchange at Annawan, Illinois. I-80 connects Kewanee to major Midwest and Northeast US markets, as well as to markets in the Great Plains, Mountain States, and the West Coast.

Kewanee is located 20 miles east of I-74. I-74 connects the Quad Cities, IL/IA and Peoria, IL Metro Areas and continues through several Midwestern States and services a number of Southeastern States. I-80 and I-74 converge 20 miles west of Kewanee.

Kewanee is 38 miles from the nearest interchange on I-88, an intrastate interstate that links Western Illinois to the Chicago Metro Area.

US 34, IL 78, IL 81 all converge in downtown Kewanee providing for the convenient flow of products through the area.

Healthcare

Since 1919, the City of Kewanee has been served by Kewanee Hospital. A dedicated staff of nearly 300 health care professionals provides health care services to residents in a 30 mile radius. Kewanee Hospital is a 501(c) 3 charitable organization, not supported by tax dollars. The state-of-the-art facility constructed in 2008 offers the latest in advanced medical technologies including:

Specialty clinic services include anesthesiology, cardiology, family medicine, general surgery, orthopedics, ophthalmology, radiology, and urology. Provision of these local services often precludes the need for members of our community members to travel to larger facilities located as far as an hour or more away.

Higher Education

Black Hawk College

The Black Hawk College East Campus serves 1,000 students and is nationally and internationally renowned for its Agriculture and Equestrian programs. The campus attracts students from all over and, as a result, has developed residential dormitories to serve this population.

As a community college, Black Hawk excels at offering vocational and customized training resources to area businesses. Taxes

Illinois Corporate Income Tax

According to the Illinois Tax Code, every corporation receiving income in Illinois is subject to tax on net income. The tax rate is 7.3%, 4.8% of which is the income tax and 2.5% of which is the property replacement tax (there is no tax on personal property in Illinois).

Illinois Franchise Tax

Illinois corporations are also subject to a franchise tax. The tax is based on the share of a corporation's paid-in capital in the state of Illinois. The initial franchise tax is imposed at the beginning of the corporation's first year doing business in the state. The initial franchise tax rate is 0.15% of the share of paid-in capital in Illinois. The franchise tax must be no less than \$25.00 and no more than \$2 million. After a corporation's first year, the franchise tax is due annually at a rate of .10%, again with a minimum of \$25.00 and a maximum of \$2 million.

Quality of Life

Parks & Recreation:

There are 8 parks in Kewanee containing almost 400 acres of green space and recreational areas (Windmont Park, Baker Park, Northeast Park, Chautauqua Park, West Park, McKinley Park, Veterans Park, and Francis Park). Concerts in the Park – Every summer, the Kewanee Chamber of Commerce sponsors a series of free concerts in Veterans Park every Thursday evening. Great way to wind down with music, refreshments, and mingling with friends.

More on 34 – Every June, communities along Route 34 from Galesburg to Aurora stage one of the largest garage sales/flea markets in the world. The route extends from Western Illinois up to the Chicago suburbs and includes Kewanee. Enjoy the sales, the flea markets, crafts, activities, and entertainment for over 100 miles. Windmont Park Christmas – Every year, volunteers turn Windmont Park into a Christmas Wonderland of whimsical displays. Open between December 5th to New Year's Day, admission to the park is free and a must for area residents.
